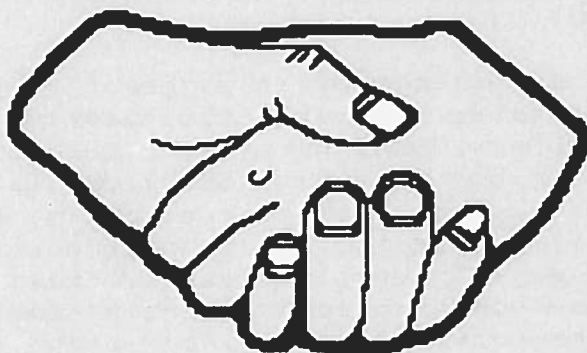

- V COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT
- A) Elders Day, final report-P.O'Sullivan: The project was a big success. All the elders involved were very appreciative. Paul thanked everyone who helped out.
- B) Santa on the Common-T.Tomasello: Jack,filling infor Terri, reports that Santa will be there from 10am till 2pm on Dec. 15. The job of Santa has been filled, but other help is still needed. Three people in the morning and afternoon are needed to sell cocoa, etc. A sign up sheet was passed around.
- C) Santa Phone-G.Wilhelm: Gordon as not present at the meeting but it was reported that ads were going in to the Fox and Reporter.
- D) Sand for Seniors- P. St.Laurent: Peter has gotten a list of 40-50 people who need this service. Other plans are still to be completed.
- E) Nativity Scene Set-up-B.Webster: Bob reports that he and Paul Dean(last years' chaiman) discussed the logistics of the set up. Set up will be on Dec. 1st with break-down being on Jan. 5. BOB also looked over the figures with Tom Sawran for possible building of stands or other repairs. They decided that it would be too much to undertake at this late date. This would be a good project to consider for the spring or summer when time is not in such short supply.



F) TV Auction, 20 Jan.-J.Evans: Jim was not present, but Glenn reports that Jaycee manpower is requested for "lugging and tugging". Also they would like us to solicit donations of good and services with a value of \$50.00 or more.

G) Wrentham State Gala, 30 November- Tim Kennedy: WE have received five complimentary pairs of tickets for this event. They will be auctioned off at the end of the meeting. We got these tickets due to our continued support of Wrentham State. This a very fancy affair. There will be a fashion show by the Patriot wives.

## VI WAYS & MEANS

A) Haunted House-C.Ienello: Chris was of at a meeting with the Mansfield people about Haunted House business. Tom Sawran reported that there were over 7500 visitors to the House this year. WE are still waiting for the split of the money. Most of the clean-up has been completed, but another night or two might be needed. Call might be made for some manpower.

B) Christmas Tree Sale-F.Badger: Fred reports that they had their first committee meeting this week and some decisions have been made. The work schedule will be as follows: Dec. 1 thru 24/or until all trees are sold. The hours will be: 6pm-9pm Mon-Fri., 9am-9pm Sat., and 9am-6pm Sundays. Trees will be delivered on the day after Thanksgiving. A lot of manpower is needed on this project. Everyone is expected to put in a shift or two! This has the potential for a good profit(we need it!), so say yes when called!

C) Celebrity Roast fact finder-SShepardson: This is just waiting for Vin Igo to say OK to being roasted. The plan is to have a big event at the Lakeview Pavillion to benefit the Foxboro High School Jazz Band, and help with their trip to Russia. Cable TV are very interested in videoing the event.

D) Jaycee Sleds-T.Sawran: Tom showed us a sample of plastic slider that he cut out of some free construction material. The idea is to try to find an outlet for selling these. After much discussion, a motion was made to "cut 'em up and sell 'em". An amended motion was made to proceed only if we could be assured by State Jaycee sources that we would not have any undue liability. The amended motion passed and Tom sent around a sign-up sheet to look for helpers.

E) Light Bulb Sale-J.Zarella: John did a lot of leg work investigating the sale of energy saving light bulb as a possible fund raiser. It turns out that Mass. Electric's transformers are not compatible with this type of bulb and it would cause a bunch of trouble. They are working towards changing over all the transformers, but it won't be complete for some time.

## VII MEMBERSHIP



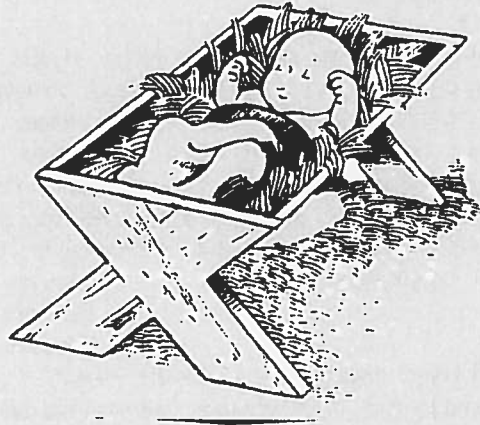
## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Proceeds from the project are used to seed various community projects, fund scholarships and help needy organizations and individuals.



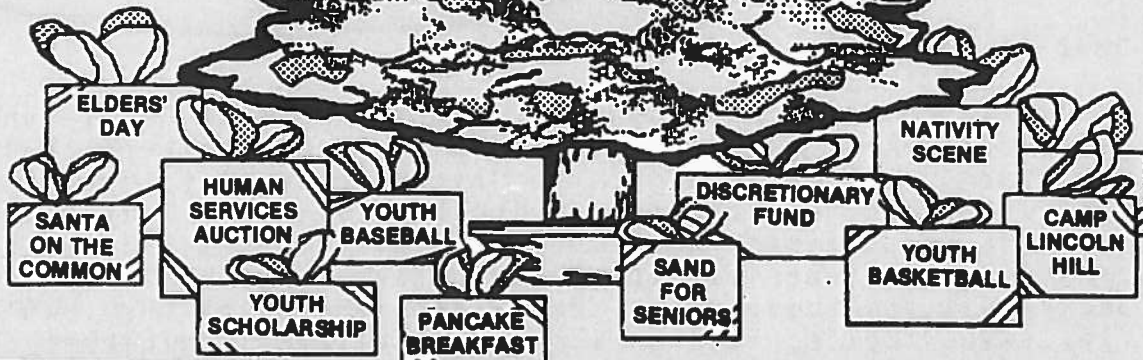

## Commitment is the Maine attraction for the Zarrellas

Commitment is a word to describe the Zarrella family: parents John and Wendy and children Katrina, who attends Burrell School, and Jeffrey, an 11-year-old at the Ahern School. All four have strong commitments to Foxboro while Wendy and John feel an added commitment to the town of Kennebunkport, Maine, where they own the Z Name gift shop.

Their Foxboro loyalty began nine years ago when John was a novelty items sales representative with an eastern Massachusetts and Rhode Island territory. While viewing a home in Wrentham, the young couple and their young boy took a side trip through the town of Foxboro. Seeing the Common made them decide they "had to look in this town." The next thing they knew, with the help of a local realtor, they ended up in the home where they still live today. A week after they passed papers their daughter was born.

Both children understand the importance of commitment. Jeffrey, who loves to both participate in and watch sports, also has a strong love of music and plays the violin in the school orchestra. Torn between being a baseball player or a librarian, Jeffrey has a strong love of reading, naming *Hatchet* as one of his favorite books along with the *Autobiography of Roger Clemens*, which he is reading right now. Jeffrey volunteers to help out in the Ahern School library during one of his study periods.

Katrina, along with being involved in dance, basketball, and Girl Scouts, developed a recycling program at her school. One day she told her mom that they were "wasting the brown paper bags at school." Rather than talk about the problem, she got her friend, Lisa Florenzo, involved in setting up a recycling program. The young duo in Mrs. Cochrane's class fill a "big black trash bag every two weeks." She, with the help of her mom, takes the bags to the recycling center.

And commitment to Foxboro is important to both John and Wendy. John coaches Katrina's youth basketball team and Jeffrey's youth baseball team, in addition to serving on the Jaycees' Board of Directors. Besides helping out at the Burrell and Ahern schools, Wendy is a member of the Women of Today group, an outgrowth of the original Jaycee Women. She also co-chairs the bloodmobile at the Bethany Church.

The flip side of their lives is Kennebunkport, where John was instrumental in organizing merchants to jointly construct an information and hospitality center in the center of town. Although neighboring Kennebunk had a Chamber of Commerce, Kennebunkport — renowned as the summer White House for the Bush family — did not. After forming the organization, John, as a representative of the business community, attended months and months of meetings seeking approvals before the center opened.

The center has been beneficial to all area businesses, including Z Name. Seven years ago, Wendy, an art major, and John, who has a strong marketing background, combined efforts to open their shop. Their gift line ranges from hand-painted clothes and sneakers to a line of presidential souvenirs. They take pride in recently adding a line of recycled note papers and also always having included items made in America.

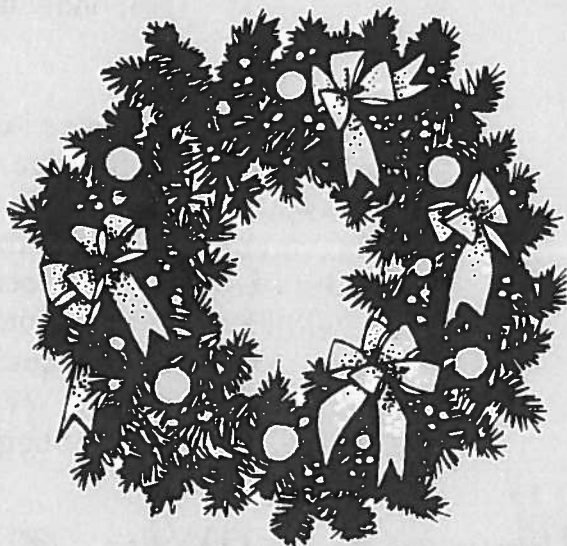
