

- V. Treasurers report:- A report was handed out at the meeting we currently have a positive cash flow.
- VI. Individual Development:-



VII. Budget: The budget was passed!!!


VIII. Project of the Month: This month was a tie. The winners were the Scholarships, and the PawSox outing





BOOTH PLAYGROUND BENCHES
