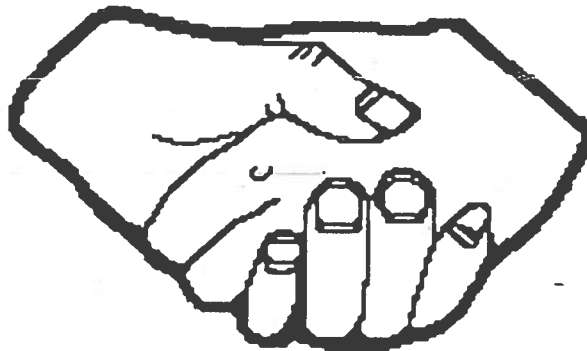

Local Jaycee president: He's no flash in the par

Fred Badger loves to meet people. Always has. That's one reason he joined the Foxboro Jaycees five years ago.

Last May he was elected president of the local service organization. Now he meets so many people he can hardly remember them all.

It's been a match made in heaven.

Fred's first Jaycee project was helping build the playground at the Taylor School. His biggest came when he chaired the chicken barbecue for the first Founders Day celebration.

How big was it? Initially, the Jaycees were told to plan on serving approximately 300 dinners. The figures soon rose to around 600 dinners. Ultimately, they served over 1,000 chicken dinners at that first Founders Day in Foxboro.

Of course, conditions that first year were superb. At the second annual Founders Day celebration the group had to contend with rain, and this past year, although it was extremely warm, numbers were down.

Fred thinks the hot air balloons were a magnet drawing people to the Booth Playground; not having them this year made a difference. However, he says each year the Jaycees improve their efficiency, and he looks forward to the annual event.

In between working for the local organization and each holding a full-time job, Fred and his wife, Kathy, manage to do many family things with their two children: Jonathan, age 11 and Ryan, age 5.

Jonathan, who will be entering the sixth grade at the Ahern School this fall, is immersed in a summer school art course. His group is doing a comic book and Jonathan is responsible for drawing a character who will be the leader.

In his own words, his character is "short and fat and carries a big tommy gun and sits behind a desk and gives orders. That's what they're like in the movies."

Hoping someday to be a cartoonist, Jonathan says Marvel comics are his favorite.

Cartoons aside, his greatest passion at present is collecting baseball cards. He also collects Legos and makes little models.

His mother says he has liked doing things with his hair and recalls the time when he was three years old and made a batch of flour and water paste the remainder of which somehow got left unnoticed and hardened in the bowl. It took Kathy three days to get the spoon and be separated.

Younger brother Ryan loves play outside. Often he can be seen pushing his wheelbarrow around to help his parents with the outside chores. He also likes to make his mom nervous playing on the monkey bars or his swing set. Ryan points out that if a slide isn't added to his swing set soon, he just might lodge a consumer complaint.

Even though it's still mid-July, Ryan is already set for the start of school in September, proudly displaying his new red, blue and yellow Fisher Price backpack. Right now it is filled with summer items including a Cabbage Patch doll, a baseball and part to his train set. But he assures everyone as soon as starts, it will be filled with paper and markers.

Fred finds time away from his job as assistant vice-president of data processing operations at BayBanks in Waltham to play golf at least twice a month. Foxborough Country Club rates high as a "challenging, yet not semi-public course."

Kathy finds most of her spare time spent with the children and as for any future dreams "outside of winning Megabucks is "lead a happy life and have what is best for our kids."

With a little prodding she'll tell you "we are going to Hawaii one of these years." In the meantime they are happy packing a picnic lunch and heading out to the beach for the day.

Kathy also would like to join the local historical society. She has always enjoyed history and would like to learn more about the town "where we plan to live forever and ever."

Both look forward to another challenging year in the Jaycees. For Kathy that means taking over as publicity chairman and her husband oversees all parts of the organization.

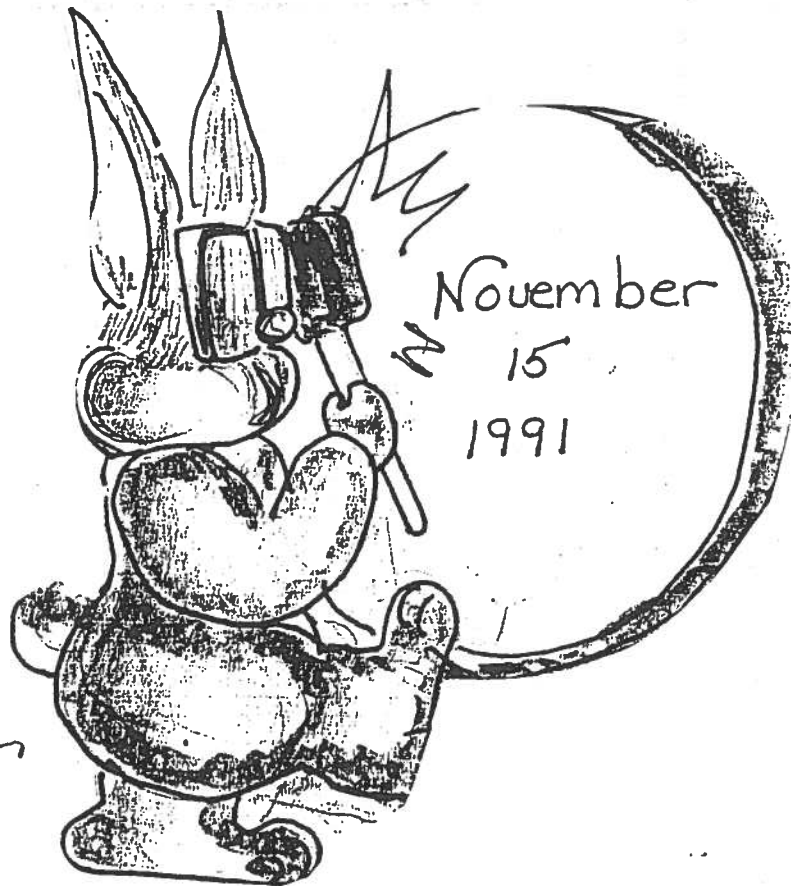
IX. New Business:

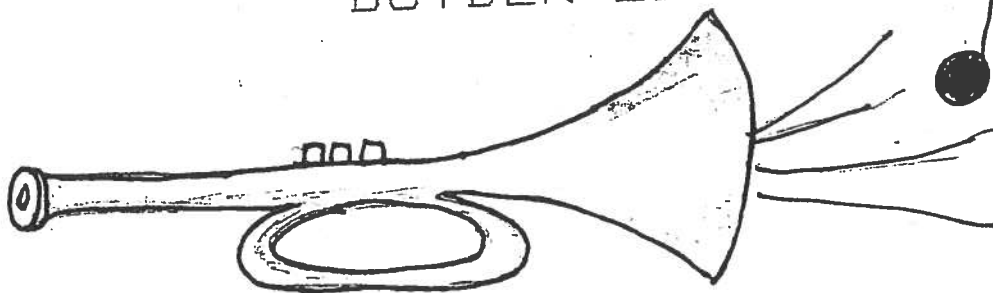

Local teens arrested in car break

Quick thinking by a Foxboro police officer led to the arrest of a 17-year-old local youth and two juveniles alleged to have been targeting and breaking into parked cars in the Elm Street/Hillcrest Road area.

Jeffrey Catlin, 17, of 3 Faxon St. was arrested along with two juveniles and charged with receiving stolen property, three counts of breaking and entering, larceny over \$100 and possession of burglarious tools.

Catlin was arrested shortly after midnight Monday by officers Daniel Rockett, Scott Austin and Scott Taggart who were patrolling in the area following reports of suspicious activity.

Rockett matched up a vehicle with a description of one reported to

police earlier Monday evening. Upon stopping the car, police discovered the stolen items - including apparatus used to syphon gasoline from tanks.

Catlin was arraigned in Western Norfolk District Court on Tuesday and continued to a later date. Police said the two juveniles will appear in closed session, also at a later date.

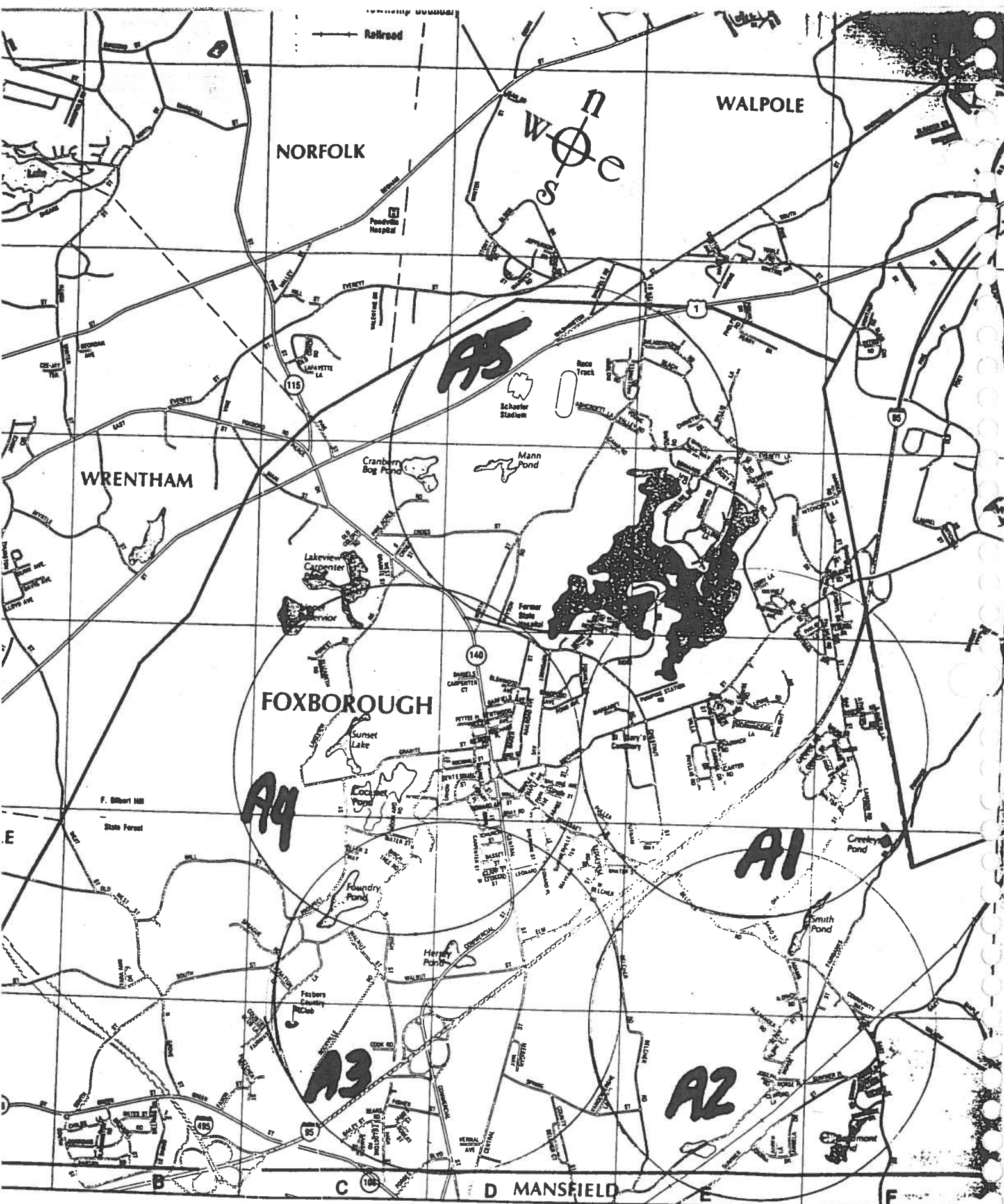
Dennis Curtis, 39, of 27A Elm St. was arrested Friday night following a domestic disturbance. He was arraigned Monday and his case continued.
