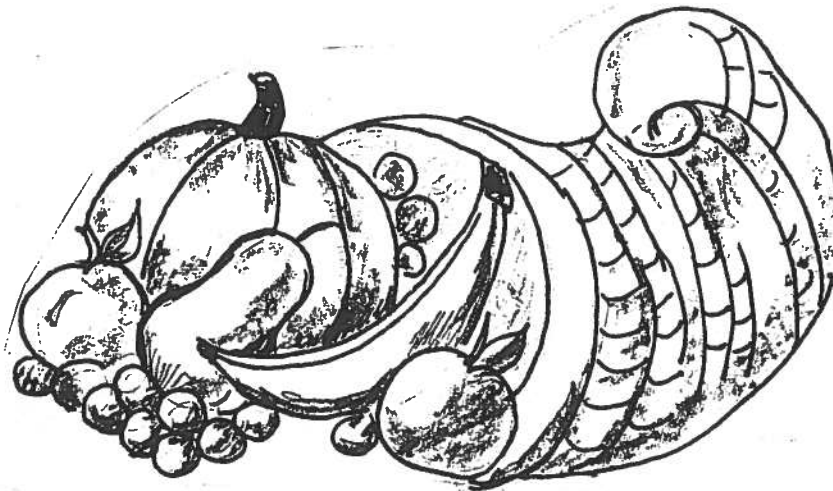
Keep in mind, that we are going to be very busy through the holidays. There are many projects that are going to run and your help will be needed. Please continue to show your support.

SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM: A six week summer educational program for Foxboro Special Needs students.



SANTAPHONE

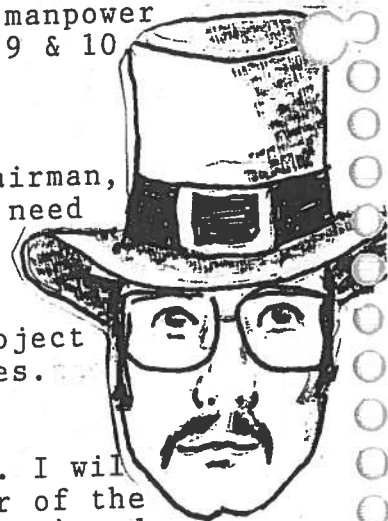

Please let the Jaycees know that they could help us. The Foxborough Museum of Discovery, located at 26 Chestnut Street, needs volunteers to help keep order, explain very basic principles in science, math and art and to generally "man" the museum so that the general public can come in and enjoy themselves.

The museum is opened Tuesday through Saturday from 10:00 to 5:00 and Sunday from 1:00 to 5:00. We are closed on Mondays and Major Holidays.

Generally, we draw from over 45 towns in Massachusetts and Rhode Island towns as well. We have had several area (and not so area) schools call to book field trips. I expect many more will do the same. In order to make these trips valuable to the children I need to be sure that there are mature persons spread throughout the museum to direct them to different exhibits and answer questions.

We are asking people to donate 4 hours a week of their time. If that is too much - perhaps it could be 4 hours a month.

Any help the Jaycees could give to the museum - well it really will be appreciated.



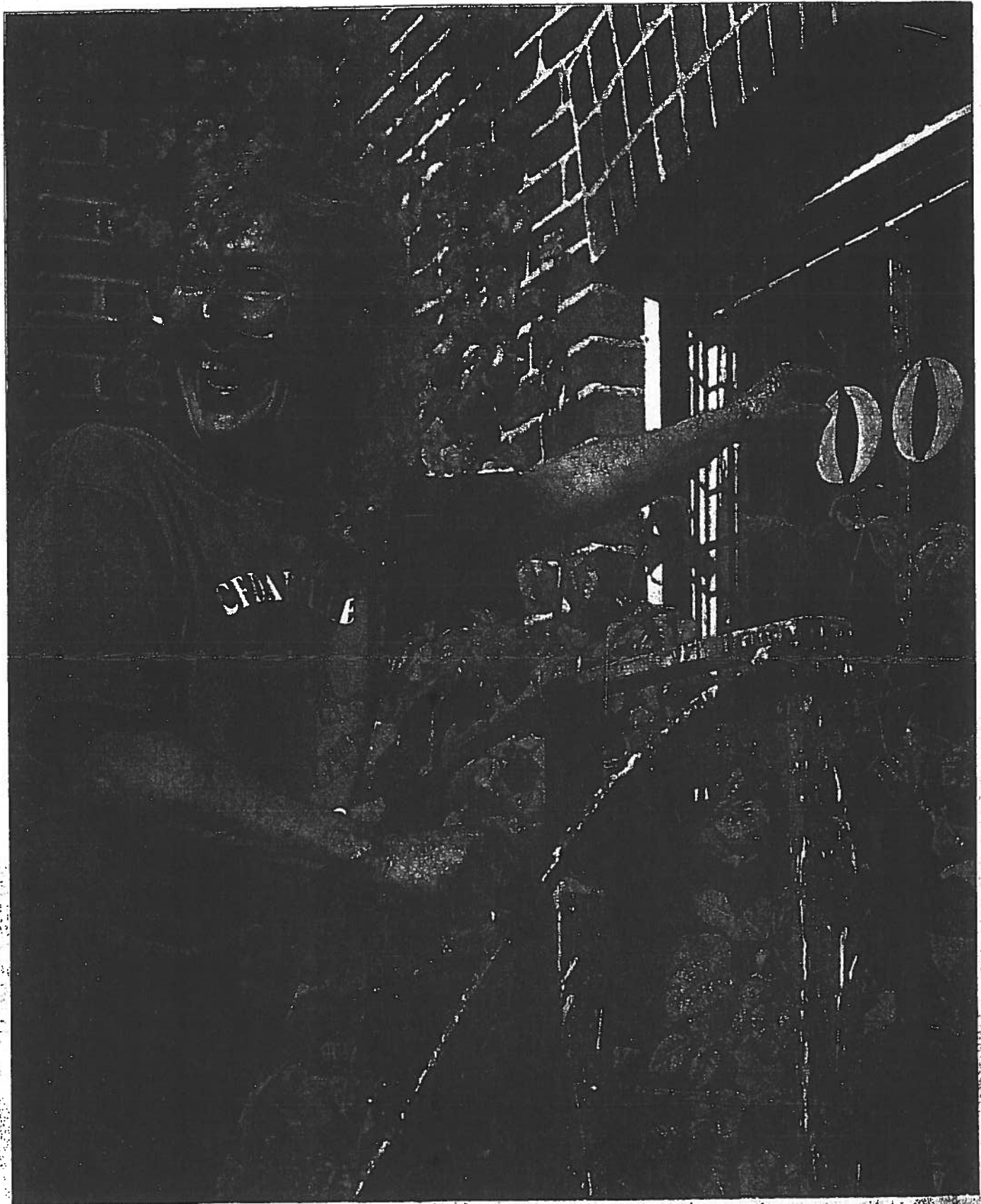

Anyone with ideas for any projects that would fall under the Individual Development area feel free to contact me. After the holiday season there will be much more time to work on member oriented projects.



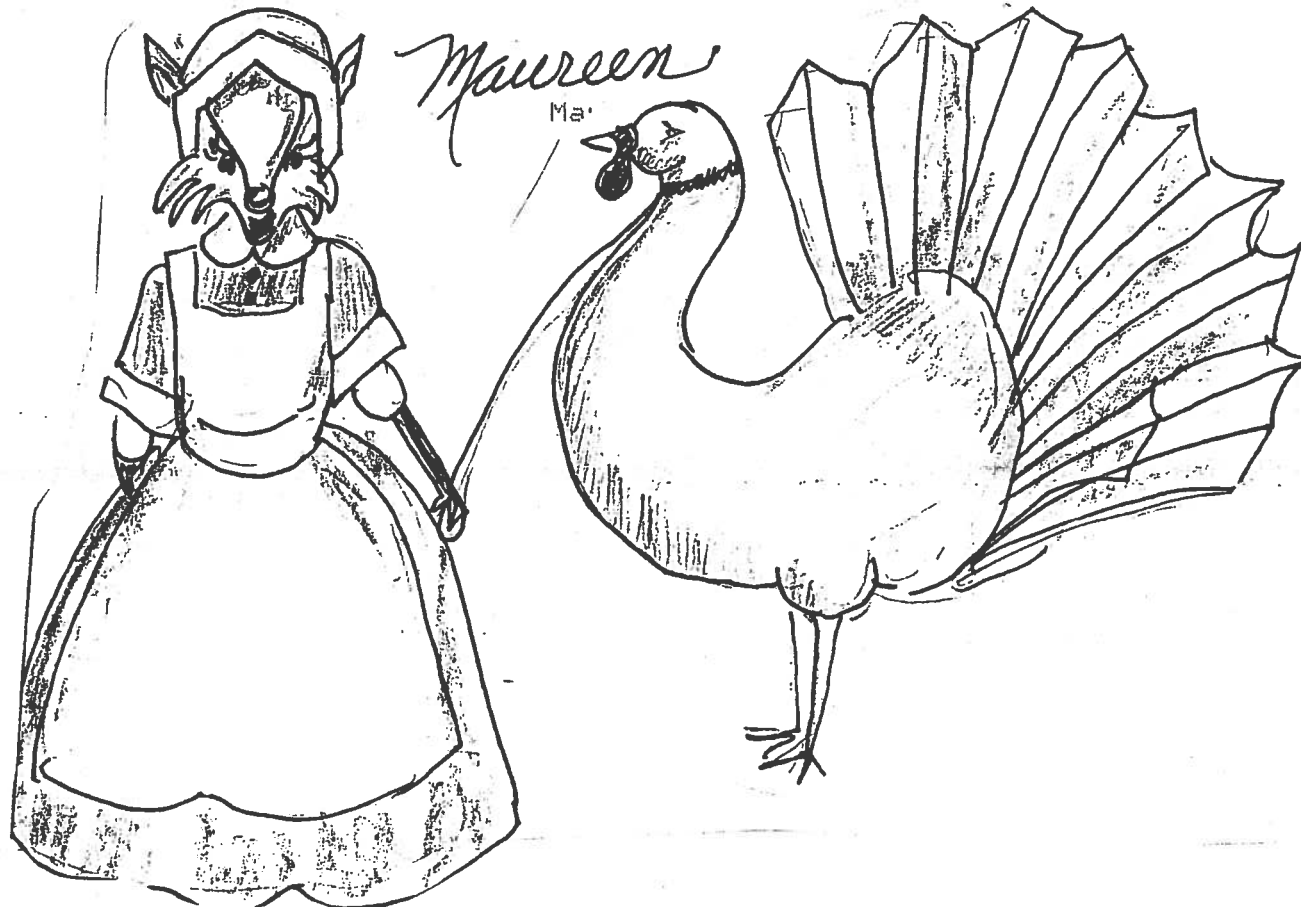
