nically, it was not the first time Rodman had been honored by the Foxboro Jaycees. In 3, he received the club's distinguished service award.

Jack Authelet, speaking from the perspective of a former newspaper editor and also on behalf of the Foxboro Discretionary Fund, called the Jaycees a "continual supportive presence" for the community.

"Having seen the various projects over the years I cannot help being impressed with the energy and the imagination," he said. "If making a difference is what it's all about then you people have truly arrived."

Authelet was later presented with a \$500 donation to the Foxboro Discretionary Fund.

"This organization still believes in local community support for those who need it most," Heehan said in handing over the check.

In a separate presentation, Mechan

presented historical commission member Richard Legee a copy of the Foxboro's Jayce charter, to be displayed at Memorial Hall.

Selectman James Evans, who along wil colleague Donald Schmidt is a member of th local chapter, presented a citation from th Board of Selectmen. Evansused the opportun ty to poke a little inter-fraternal fun Selectman Michael Coppola, a long-tim member of the Foxboro Lions Club

"As you may know, two of the three members of the Board of Selectmen are Jaycees; Mr. Coppola wishes he was," Evan said. "With a little prodding I think we coul make him an associate member. Of cours he'd have to pay dues for the past 25 years."

Acknowledging their behind-thescenes roles as civic benefactors, Foxboro Jaycees last Friday honored Gerry Rodman and Raschel Grey during the organization's 30th anniversary celebration at Lakeview Pavilion.

With more than 160 in attendance, including 19 of the club's 29 past-presidents, Rodman and Grey received the club's "community service award" for their long-standing commitment to the community.

Master of ceremonies William Meehan termed Grey, owner of Raschel's children's clothing store, "an extremely successful business person — as you well know if you've

ever tried to drive down Route 140 a week before school starts:"

Meehan outlined Grey's contributions to various Jaycee projects, and in particular her efforts on behalf of the Foxboro Discretionary Fund.

"There's a lot of families in the town who are a little bit happier because of Raschel Grey," Meehan said.

Rodman, a former town official long affiliated with the Discretionary Fund and numerous other characterized as "a successful businessman and a successful family man."

1 WHAT IS THE TAG PROGRAM?

TRAINING-ACTIVATION-GROWTH!

The TAG program is designed to emphasize the balance of Training, Activation and Growth, together as a group as with the Jaycee Concept; and striving for that balance will guarantee the development of each chapter member through service to their community.

Ask yourself the following questions:

- 1. I joined Jaycees for leadership training, community involvement and/or the social aspect, but nothing happened; how can I be responsible for my involvement and are there any chapter tools available to encourage involvement?
- 2. Do most of the members in my chapter understand Jaycees, its philosophies, its programs and what opportunities are available?
- 3. Our chapter management structure is never fully in place, do officers chairing projects have any effect on that?
- 4. Am I totally satisfied with the direction that my personal, career and/or family life is headed?
- 5. Do I want to seek further success?
- 6. Am I totally satisfied with the direction that my community is taking in areas of youth, elderly, economic development and drug and alcohol prevention? If not, what part do I want to play in helping to address these complicated challenges?
- 7. How is our chapter perceived in the community?
- 8. It seems to me that the chapter is floundering at times, what are we doing next anyway?
- 9. How can I meet and work with new acquaintances and enlarge my social contacts?
- 10. Why is it so hard to get new members to join? I joined.
- 11. What needs do I want to have met through my involvement with the Jaycees?
- 12. There are 35 members on the chapter roster, why do only the same 6 show up?
- 13. I'm in a 'small' chapter which always runs 'small', 'safe' projects; I want bigger and more exciting projects how do we make that transition?
- 14. How do I make a difference or an impact?
- 15. I have been a Jaycee for a number of years and have never really been involved with either the Management or the Individual Development programs, how do I start?

- 1. Register and actively partake in either the Springboard or Degrees of Jaycees Program, whichever is appropriate.
- 2. Partake in at least one CD project.
- 3. Attend at least 1 chapter social.
- 4. Be responsible for activating someone that was not truly active or was a QUESTIONABLE renewal. One activation or renewal per person. If your chapter does not have anyone due during the quarter or more people are involved in the TAG program that there are renewals or non-active people, see your TAG Team Captain for a substitute incentive that will be tailored to your chapter's needs.

GROWTH AREA - INDIVIDUALS:

SAM JANKOVICH Chief Executive Officer

On December 20, 1990, Patriots' Owner and Chairman Victor K. Kiam named Sam Jankovich as his Chief Executive Officer and the organization embarked on a new path for the 1991 season and beyond. Jankovich, the University of Miami's Athletic Director from 1982-89, oversees, the overall operation of the organization.

"Our long-term goal for this franchise is for it to be one of the real sources of pride for the New England states," says Jankovich. "Secondly, we want the Patriots to represent the NFL in a first-class fashion, and we want to have a consistent and winning program. We have a golden opportunity with the Patriots right now. I believe the NFL really brings about a competitive balance, probably more than any other professional sport. As long as we work together, we will turn this franchise around, and it will be competitive. I sincerely believe that you will see this football team play very hard this year, and it will be a very enthusiastic team, and it will have the personality of Dick MacPherson."

During his eight years at the University of Miami, the 56-year-old Jankovich was in charge of a program which won seven national championships: football (1983, 1987 and 1989), baseball (1985), men's tennis (singles in 1987), women's golf (1984) and women's tennis (doubles in 1986).

In October of 1990, Jankovich was very instrumental in Miami's entrance

into the Big East Conference, effective in the fall of 1991.

Under Jankovich's leadership, the University of Miami added several new athletic buildings, including the Knight Sports Complex which houses the Hurricane men's and women's basketball programs.

In subsidizing the growth and expansion of facilities and nationally elite programs, Jankovich broke new ground in the challenging area of funding a major college program within a private institution. In cultivating the support of the South Florida community, Jankovich oversaw the development of the Hurricane Club into a financial foundation that increased its annual gift total from \$750,000 in 1982 to more than \$3 million in 1989-90.

Additional revenues were generated through Hurricane appearances on national television. From 1986-90, Miami football, basketball and baseball teams made 74 network television appearances. During the 1989 and 1990 seasons, the football team played 13 of its 24 games on national television. Jankovich also negotiated radio and television contracts for UM coaches and staff.

His success earned Jankovich a great deal of national respect and recognition. He was President of the NCAA Division I-A Athletic Directors, First Vice-President of the National Association of College Directors of Athletics and was on the Executive Board of the College Football Association (CFA).

Prior to going to Miami, Jankovich served as athletic director at Washington State University. While competing in the PAC-10 Conference, his teams participated in their first bowl game in 50 years (1981 Holiday Bowl), made two NCAA basketball tournament appearances and captured a conference title in track.

Jankovich, a native of Butte, Montana, and the former Patty Mullins have three children: Michael, Sue Ellen and Sam Jr. He also has eight grandchildren.
