

Inmates to detail substance abuse struggle

Two prison inmates escorted by authorities will discuss their personal struggle with substance abuse and rehabilitation 7 to 8 p.m. tonight (Sept. 17) in the downstairs Fuller Room at Boyden Library.

The session is directed toward middle and high school students and adults.

Part of the Our Community Cares Campaign, the program is sponsored by the Foxboro Youth Coalition, the Foxboro Police Department and the Foxboro Jay-

cees.

"Drug abuse is one of the key concerns in our society, and until we start dealing effectively with prevention, it'll be a continuing cancer," said Police Chief Edward O'Leary.

O'Leary said the inmates, who are serving sentences at the new Dedham jail on Route 128, will be escorted by deputies Fred Caniff and Jim Wells of the Norfolk County Sheriff's Department. The specially-trained officers have made many

presentations to school groups and PTOs in the county.

"The most important part of this program is not the information presented by the deputies, but the candid comment from inmates coming down to participate in the program," O'Leary said.

As a community service, inmates in the pre-release stage give talks about their experiences with substance abuse and addiction.

This talk was organized by Mary Marshall of the Foxboro Jaycees.
