Politics and pancakes compliment each other

Politics is once again in the air, and the candidates for several town offices are out to capture your vote. Once again they will be lined up at the Foxboro Jaycees pancake breakfast on March 28.

For the past 18 years, the breakfast, held shortly after the deadline for filing nomination papers, has been regarded as the unofficial start of the campaign season here in Foxboro. This is one of those events that all prospective candidates love — hungry voters coming in with families and friends.

Historically, the arrangement has remained within acceptable bounds. Residents have grown to expect the

politicking, and many even now use the pancake breakfast as a sociable opportunity to look over the new field of contenders.

Last year, however, a number of political agendas muddied the true purpose of the event. Diners entering the high school cafeteria were all but assaulted by a line of campaigners **The Foxboro Reporter** described as a gauntlet.

This level of politicking, uncharacteristically intense and aggressive, made for an uncomfortable and awkward situation — both for diners and for Foxboro Jaycees running the event. The breakfast is not first and foremost a political event — unlike Senate President William Bulger's annual St. Patrick's Day breakfast held this past week — but a local fund-raiser for CYO youth basketball. As such, the Jaycees this year intend to establish some ground rules about political activity.

Peter St. Laurent, chairman for the project, is asking that candidates or political action groups who want to campaign at the breakfast contact him prior to March 28 to review some of the dos and don'ts.

The Jaycees, as always, are hoping for a good turnout. There's nothing wrong with having some fun, eating plenty of pancakes and getting a little side dish of local politics at the same time — as long as it compliments sausage and maple syrup.


