GUIDELINES CONCERNING CHILDREN WORKING AT THE HAUNTED HOUSE

PURPOSE: THE PURPOSE OF THESE GUIDELINES ARE TO GIVE A MEANS FOR PARENTS TO EVALUATE WHEN IT MIGHT BE APPROPRIATE OR INAPPROPRIATE FOR A CHILD TO WORK AT THE HAUNTED HOUSE. IN THE PAST WE HAVE HAD MANY OCCASIONS WHERE OUR CHILDREN HAVE BEEN AN EFFECTIVE PART OF THE PROGRAM AND WE ARE SURE THAT THEY HAVE BENEFITED FROM THE EXPERIENCE. AT THE SAME TIME SITUATIONS HAVE OCCURRED WHERE CHILDREN HAVE BEEN LESS THAN HELPFUL AND MOST LIKELY HAVE NOT BENEFITED FROM THE EXPERIENCE. WE THINK THE REASONS FOR THIS COME DOWN TO PARENTAL PLANNING, SUPERVISION , CONTROL AND PARENTAL EVALUATION OF HOW THE CHILD IS HANDLING HIS/HER RESPONSIBILITIES.

AT THE OUTSET ALL FOXBORD JAYCEES ARE REMINDED OF THE REIMBURSE-MENT PROGRAM FOR BABY SITTING THAT WILL ALLOW FOR CHILD CARE WHILE YOU ARE WORKING. MORE DETAILS ON THIS CAN BE OBTAINED FROM THE HAUNTED HOUSE COMMITTEE MEMBERS ON THIS PROGRAM.

IN MANY SITUATIONS WE HAVE FOUND THAT YOUNGER CHILDREN ARE NOT INTERESTED IN WORKING THE HAUNTED HOUSE, THEY JUST WANT TO SEE IT. WE HAVE A FAMILY NIGHT (OCTOBER 14) WHICH IS FOR EVERYONE TO ATTEND. ATTENDING FAMILY NIGHT CAN VERY WELL ADDRESS THE CHILD'S DESIRE TO SEE THE HAUNTED HOUSE. ALSO CHILDREN ARE WELCOME TO VISIT THE HOUSE DURING CONSTRUCTION.

HAVING SAID ALL OF THIS THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES SHOULD BE FOLLOWED:

- 1- JOBS SHOULD BE ESTABLISHED THRU THE PROJECT OR ROOM CHAIR BEFORE YOU ARRIVE AT THE HOUSE. ROOM CHAIRS STAFF THEIR ROOMS AND THE PROJECT CHAIR WILL NOT ASSIGN CHILDREN TO ROOMS.
- 2-THE CHILD'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST BE WORKING AS WELL. NO DROP OFFS. PROJECT MANAGEMENT CANNOT AND WILL NOT WATCH CHILDREN.
- 3-THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST CHECK PERIODICALLY TO SEE HOW THE CHILD IS DOING AND IF NECESSARY REMOVED THE CHILD FROM THE HOUSE IF IT IS NOT WORKING OUT.
- 4-IT IS EXPECTED THAT THE CHILD WHEN WORKING WILL WORK THE ENTIRE PERFORMANCE JUST AS WE EXPECT THAT FROM ADULTS. LEAVING BEFORE THE SHOW IS OVER WILL DISRUPT THE QUALITY OF THE SHOW.
- 5-THE CHILD SHOULD NOT BRING A FRIEND WITH THEM. THE CHILD SHOULD UNDERSTAND THAT THIS IS NOT A SOCIAL EVENT.

6-WE HAVE FOUND THAT YOUNGER CHILDREN WORK OUT BEST WHEN WORKING ALONGSIDE AN ADULT (OUT OF COSTUME) DOING SUCH THINGS AS CONCESSIONS AND FOOD DISTRIBUTION. OLDER CHILDREN HAVE DONE WELL OPERATING LIGHTS IN ROOMS AND AS MAZE MONSTERS. PARENTS ARE EXPECTED TO EXPLAIN THESE JOBS TO THEIR CHILDREN BEFOREHAND.
