"The definition of success is not only survival, the having - it is the quality of every moment of your life, the being. Success is not a destination, a place you can every get to; it is the quality of the journey."



#### SCHOLARSHIP REVIEW COMMITTEE - PROJECT FINDINGS (EXCERPT)

In order to clarify and standardize the method and procedures a Scholarship Selection Committee uses each year, a Scholarhip Review Committee was formed to establish some standards for the evaluation process. As a result of this committee's work, a Scholarship Judging CPG has been created and the following recommendations are made. You, the membership will be as to vote on one part of the recommendations at the December G.M.

Regarding the judging criteria, we recommend the following statement to become a permanent policy in the Policies section of the By-laws:

#### "POLICY - HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP JUDGING

A committee will be formed annually to review scholarship applications as soon as they are forwarded by the High School Guidance Department. Judging will be conducted on the basis of the following criteria:

Community service (accomplishments, activity)	35%
Scholastic achievement (class standing, awards)	20%
General outlook/Career goals (essay section)	20%
Need (anticipated sources of funding)	15%
Presentation (neatness and effort in paperwork)	10%
	100%

The committee may devise an appropriate format for reviewing the applications, (such as eliminating extremely high or low end candidates, devising a rating scale for assessing each category, etc.) but should weight the applicants responses and accomplishments according to the above criteria percentages. A Chairman's Planning Guide should be maintained by the Community Development Vice President to serve as the detailed guidelines for this project."

Regarding the issue of applications received from children of Jaycee members, the following statement should appear as a part of the Chairmans Planning Guide:

"'Special' consideratation can be given to Jaycee kids whose applications otherwise meet all of the general guidelines for this scholarship."







