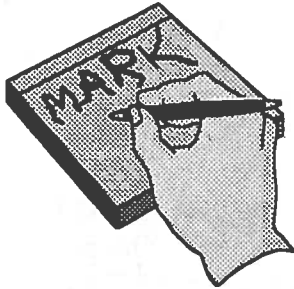

Dear Foxboro Jaycees,

I'm sure you are aware that the girls' varsity basketball team has had an exceptional season this year. After completing a season undefeated in the league, they won the Hockomock League Championship, the Division III South Sectional Championship, the Division III Eastern Regional Championship, and, finally, the Division III State Championship. To say we are proud of such an outstanding achievement would be an understatement. It is our contention that this team, above all other girls' varsity teams that Foxboro has ever fielded, deserves special recognition. It is to that end that we are addressing this letter.

Coach Damish has approached the association with a request to help him honor the girls with "state champion" sweatshirts and rings, so that they will remember their shining moment forever. He is placed in the unenviable position of trying to honor these girls with no financial support from either the town or the school administration. Though the association has been quite supportive of the school teams this season, our funds are not what we hope they will be in years to come. The "new" association has only been in existence from the beginning of this season and has not had the time to prepare itself for the kind of "special" circumstances that have occurred this season. We are adamant, however, in our support of the teams and will not allow the girls' accomplishments to go unrewarded! 

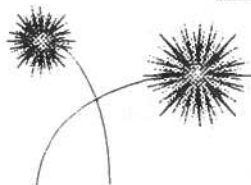

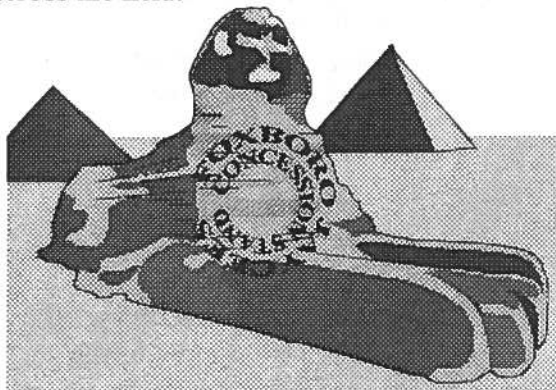
What a day! As I write this report it is still a week away and I've been in constant contact with all of my chairpersons.

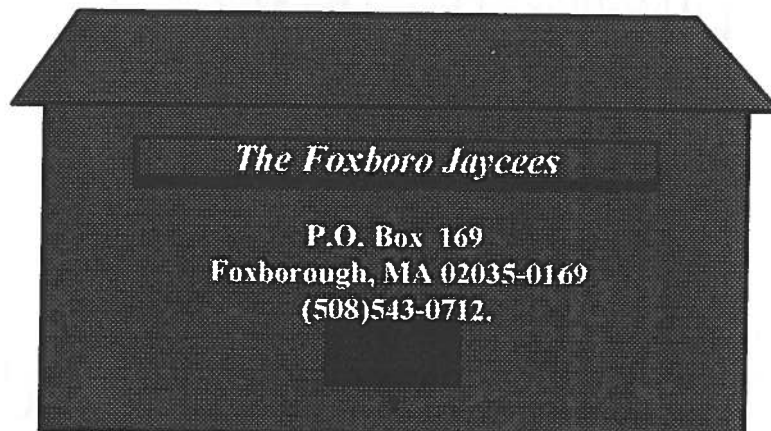
