Projects are being run and people are turning out to help.

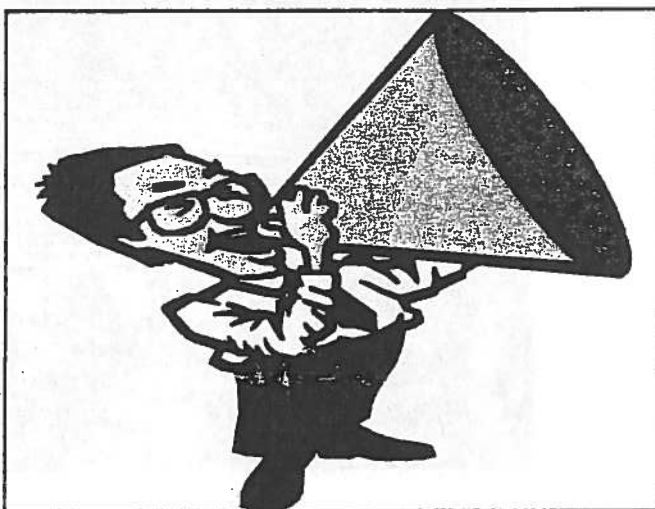
The summertime is the hardest time of the year to get people out and working. To all of you who have been helping, Thanks. For those who haven't, we really need your help.
