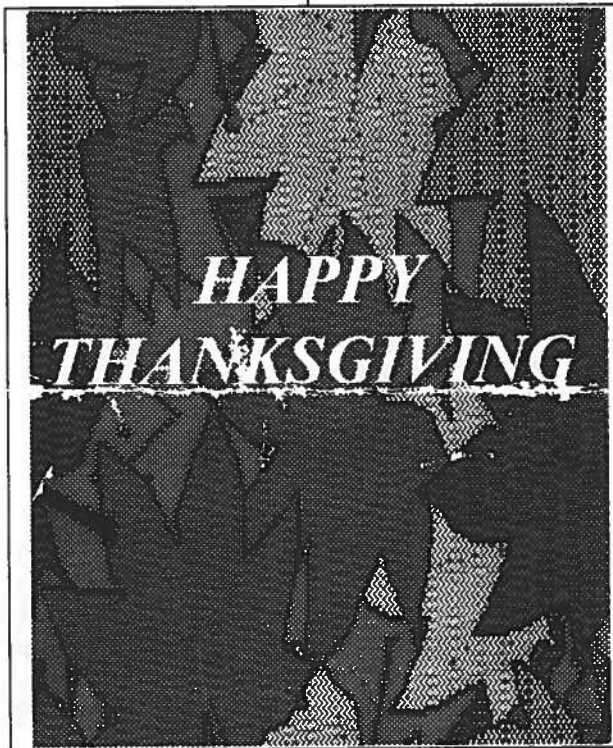

**A reminder:** Members that have C.P.G. in their files should return them to the V.P. in that area.



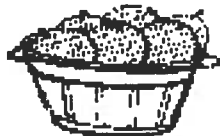

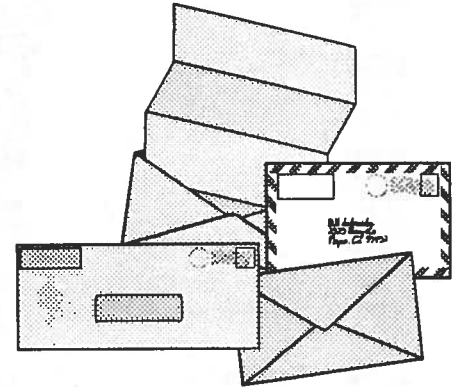
### CALL NIGHT...

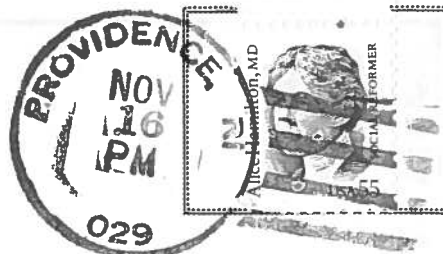
