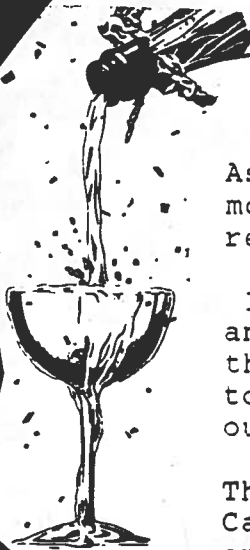

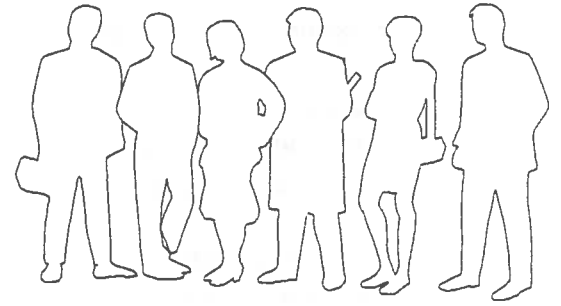

Also, the only active project this month is Concert on the Common Concessions. Bill Maddestra is doing an excellent job!

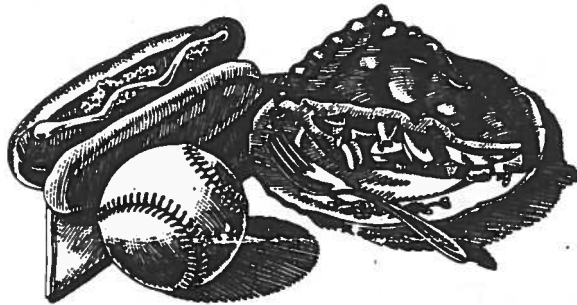
