Right now she is working to become strong enough to undergo yet another transplant. Chico, a prime donor candidate, is undergoing tests to determine if he is able to donate his kidney. All proceeds from this year's Road Race will go to Tina to help with expenses.

A tee-shirt will be guaranteed if you register by September 1st or at anytime if you get sponsored for \$25.00 or more. 
