Share Program - Chairman Needed: This is a project that the Jaycees have been involved with for a few years. It's basic purpose is to supply volunteers of the community, food at a discount price. To be eligible you need to volunteer two hours a month and for \$15 you will receive a package of food. A typical package includes meat, chicken, fruits, and vegetables. As chairman of this project your responsibilities would include setting up trucks to pick-up food, ordering the food and getting manpower to help distribute the food. At this point, everything is running well, but it should have a new chairman dedicated to at least 3 months.


