








The State of the Union Address



I would like to begin my report this month by thanking all of the members and the Board of Directors for your support and enthusiasm throughout my pregnancy. Bill, Nicholas and I are extremely lucky to have friends like the ones that we have in the Jaycees.

As the 1996-97 year begins to come to a close, I have had a chance to review our success in all areas. I am extremely proud of all of the board members and of the membership for completing the number of projects that we have and at the rate of success that has been shown.

With at least two projects left to be completed in the Ways and Means area, we have made \$1525 more than was proposed for the planned year. Steve Krug and Bill Maddestra are currently looking for a chairman for the placemats and the raffle to be completed at the pancake breakfast. I am sure that those projects will round out our Ways and Means year with an income greater than expected.

The Community Development area is expected to complete over 80% of the projects on the budget this year. There have been many worthwhile donations that have been added. Lynda Walsh and Pete Sorrow, along with all of the project chairmen have had an exceptional year thus far. All of the projects have far exceeded their expectations. Gail Workman, as a new member, has organized the Jaycee donation and manpower for the Human Services Auction, which will get a great deal of recognition in the community. Pete Sorrow and his committee are gearing up for the annual pancake breakfast for CYO Basketball.

The Individual Development area is planning to run over 75% of the projects in the planned year. Chris Hebert and Lucy Wilhelm are hoping to get some training projects and some fun socials completed within the next couple of

months. BYLAWS REVIEW

Pursuant to the Foxboro Jaycees ByLaws, March 1996 edition, Constitution Article VI - Amendments, Section 1 (a), I am hereby giving the General Membership notice, in writing, via the mailing of the February 1997 issue of the Wise Fox, of the proposed amendments to the ByLaws that will be brought before the General Membership for a vote at the March 12, 1997 General Membership Meeting. Please review the proposed amendments as contained in this Wise Fox (two pages).

BY LAW COMMITTEE REPORT and NOTICE OF PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The By Law Committee (Dave Brown, Cathy Hickey, and Lauren Bonneau-Krug and Tom Sawran) has met and proposes for a vote at the March GM two changes to bylaw which will occur thru four amendments.

The first set of changes (First 3 amendments below) would make the position of Donations Director permament. Presently if not acted on this position will be gone as policy 16 expires in April 1997. The present Donations Director as well as the Donations Committee feel that this position has worked well for the chapter and should continue. The duties of this position are the same as what was used in the trial period for the present year (Policy 16) however we have changed some wording so that a separate series of budget items related to donations can be established in future planned years. Also the position will report to the President thus relieving the CD Vice President of being directly involved with donations. We think this will ease the amount of work that the CD Vice President must now do or oversee.

Our second change (Our second and fourth amendments) involves the position of Presidential Director. If passed the position will be an appointed board position (by the President) at the option of the new president rather than an elected position. This will give the new president the option of having a 14 or 15 member board. It also lets the President select one member of their Board from the membership at large if they choose to do so. Over the years some have felt that Board is to large, if the new president would like a smaller Board they can do so. This will also create a means for Associate Members to have some representation on the Board. This change creates some flexibility as to the size and make up of the Board ---- at discretion of the President.

If either change fails to pass we will motion language to insert the position of (1) Presidential Director in Article V Section 8.

This concludes our proposal. Also enclosed are sections of the current ByLaw that are subject to the proposed amendmants.

d The following are the duties of the Donations Director:

- 1. Form and chair a standing committee (called the Donations Committee) of members from the general membership, by the June General Membership Meeting.
 - 2. Develop a donations budget for the planned year.
 - 3. Report to the President on matters related donations.
 - 4 The Donation Committee Shall:
- a Evaluate requested donations to provide information to the General Membership and/or Board as per Bylaw Article IV, Section 4.
- b. Evaluate community needs for additional donation opportunities.
- c. Work with Publicity Chairman to promote community awareness.
 - d. Document research for future reference.
- e. Report monthly to the General Membership all details pertaining to proposed donations.

4----AMEND BY-LAW ARTICLE VII SECTION 4 CONCERNING DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT BY ADDING AFTER ITEM g

h. At his discretion appoint one (1) Presidential Director from the membership who will serve on the Board.

Committee members are busy with their own separate tasks. Date is set for March 23rd. Please plan on helping out when Steve Krug (manpower chairman) calls, it's alot of fun and the money we raise goes to a great cause.

Concerts on the Common - Chairman needed to book six concerts for the summer months. We need a chairman as soon as possible, as we have already had calls from bands interested in playing for us.

Easter Egg Hunt - Sheri Duarte will be looking for help from the membership to put this project together for March 29th. There will be a sign-up sheet at the February G.M.

Headfirst Program - Chairman needed to get in-touch with Curt Ludwig from the Foxboro Police Department. Last year, the police had a program all in place and really didn't need much manpower, however our donation bought helmets to be given out at the schools. This usually doesn't happen until the spring, but we thought that if we show our interest early enough, we can help in the actual program.

1997 Road Race - Chairman needed to set up a committee and decide on this years cause. This will be our 5th annual road race. Jim Hebert ran a very successful race last year for "our hero" Chico's daughter Tina. The causes for this race vary from year to year, but the success is always huge. The race is usually run in September.
