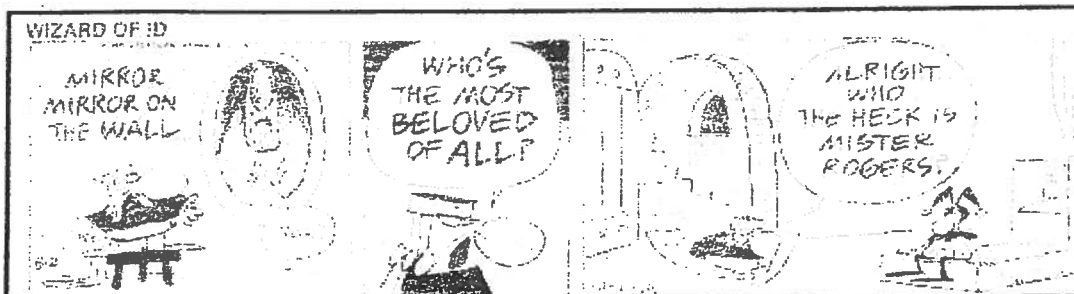

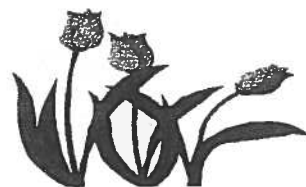

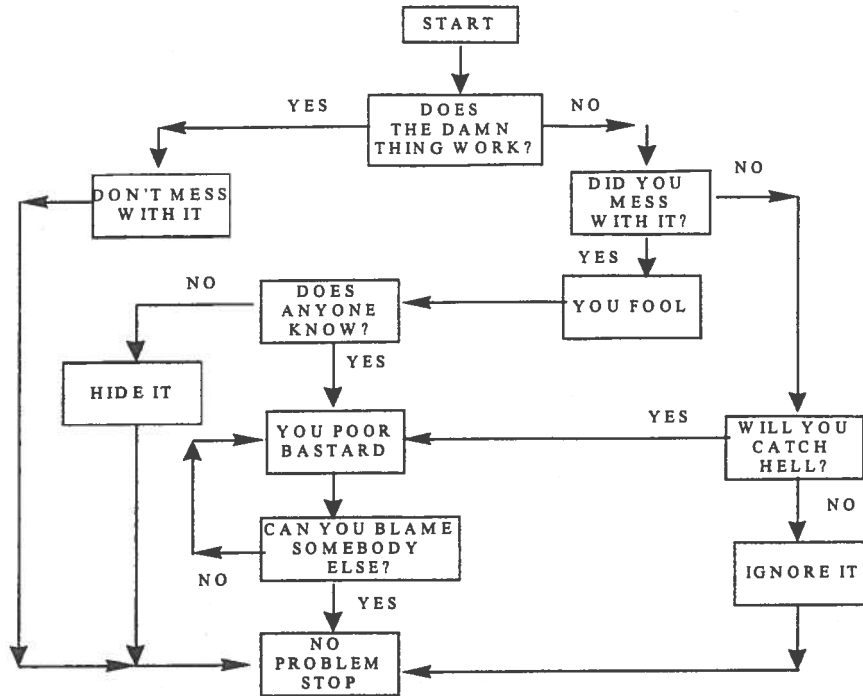

TROUBLESHOOTING FLOWCHART

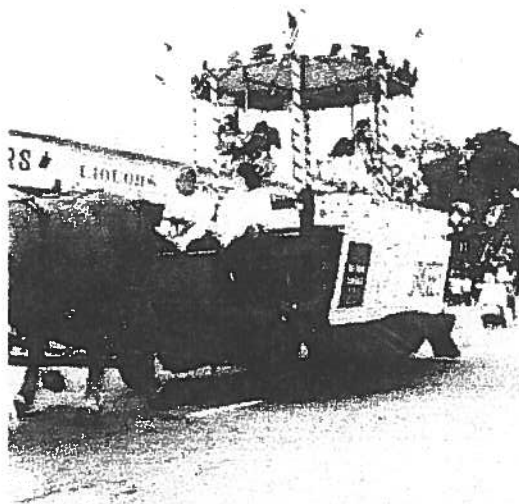
