Auditorium Committee Report-Tom Sawran

As I am sure most of you have heard by now, the sewerage treatment facility at the State Hospital has been permanently closed. This closing has left the auditorium with no bathroom facilities whatsoever. There is no where for waste water to run out of the building, so under the existing circumstances, there are no toilets and no wash-up facilities.

After a very intensive one month of factfinding, it would appear that we have two primary options. One is to import port-ajohns to serve both our customers and our staff, with wash-up facilities being available only to the staff. All of the toilet facilities would be outside, and any wash-up facility, if constructed inside, would be very rudimentary at best. A garden hose and wash tub arrangement might be on the deluxe end of what is to be available.

The second major option would be to install a new permanent septic system on the grounds which would allow the existing bathrooms to be used on a normal basis.

Much of the ground work for either constructing such a permanent system or importing some sort of temporary system has already been explored to a large extent. Identifying the costs attendant with each plan has also been done to the extent possible to the details of the issue before us. Also at this second meeting, both additional questions as well as comments and debate were encouraged to allow everyone an opportunity to air his or her opinion.

This report is being written on Labor Day. During the coming week, more details of



prices will hopefully be forthcoming as well as the In either case, it would seem that a vote on this issue is most likely to happen at the September G.M.

actual design of a system. If a new system is to go ahead, pricing and scheduling must move along

steadily to even allow the system to be installed in a timely fashion. If work toward a permanent system is to be put on hold for the time being, the Haunted House committee will need ample time to prepare for setting up some type of temporary system.

In either case, it would seem that a vote on this issue is most likely to happen at the September G.M. Obviously, the most up-to-the-minute information on costs for each option will be made available at that time.

Those of us who spend night after night working this project have a lot

at stake with this issue. Should anyone have any additional questions or information, please direct them to me at your convenience.
