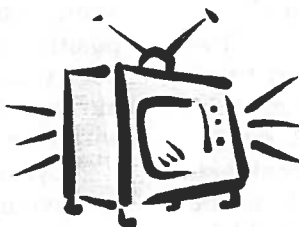
Lynn, who seems to be able to

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put anyone at ease, is a Mansfield resident who lived in Foxboro for five years. She's worked at the Learning Link, a teacher's supply store, for about ten years, doing "a little bit of everything," including orders, displays, management... Whatever is needed. She has one son, 15 year old Mike, who she says is at "that age" - "that age" being the time when children are embarrassed to be seen with their parents. But she laughs it off -- the two are very close.

A while back, as we sat amid the construction of the Haunted House, I commented, "What's hard about interviewing someone such as yourself is that it's difficult to know where to begin. You've accomplished so much with the Jaycees over the years."

Lynn nods with a smile. "I've done almost everything! I did three nights at the Haunted House my first year; I've done EVERY night since." She's done the pancake breakfast, Christmas tree sales... Well, to be honest, trying to list them would be silly. Suffice it to say, if it's a Jaycee project, Lynn has probably been involved with it.

Currently serving as Membership VP, Lynn has also served as dues director and served in a variety of capacities for the chapter. One of her favorite accomplishments was running the concerts on the common in 1994. "That was really fun," she adds. "I loved seeing people of all age groups together - you had the seniors up front with their lounge chairs, and the little kids dancing by the stage. It was great!"

"Have you won Jaycee awards?"

She tells me she has, and is one of the distinguished members of the chapter to win Jaycee of the month in two successive months.

"Very impressive! How about

frogs!"

"Nope," she says with a large smile, "I'm proud to say I've been frog free for four years."

As we toured the house and tried to keep an eye on some of the teen-age volunteers, I was trying to think of other questions to ask. "Who are you" and "what have you done for the chapter" seem inadequate in Lynn's case - everybody in the Jaycees knows her.

"You didn't ask who my favorite poet was," she suggested.

I loved it. "No one's every offered that before. OK, who's your favorite poet, and for extra credit, why?"

"Rainer Maria Rilke," she explains, "because he has a lot to say about women and casts them in a positive light." Lynn reads a lot of poetry and a lot of books. "But I love movies. My favorite is "Moonstruck" with Cher. It's so Italian."

Lynn, your many impressive achievements - and your friendliness and energy - are a great asset to the chapter!

Another very enjoyable interview was with new Jaycee **Marge Robson**. My conversation with her was lively, very funny at times, and interesting. "I love classic rock music," she begins, pointing to the speakers blaring WZLX classic rock across the Haunted House. Amidst the frenzied activity during those final days of construction before opening, she added, "Janis Joplin, Moody Blues..."

"Springsteen?" I asked hopefully.

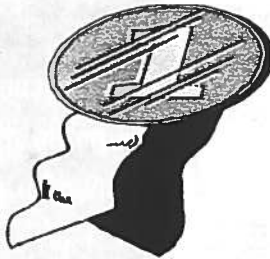

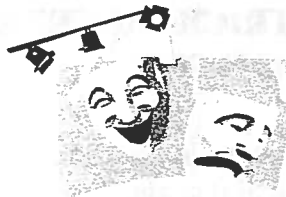

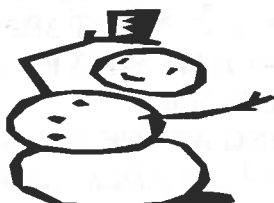

And the Directors spoke amongst themselves, saying to one another, "It contains that which aids plant growth, and it is very strong."

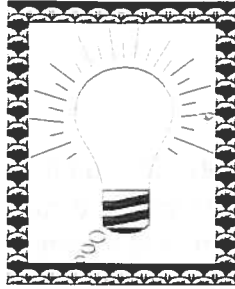
And the Directors went to the Vice Presidents, saying unto them, "It promotes growth, and it is very powerful."

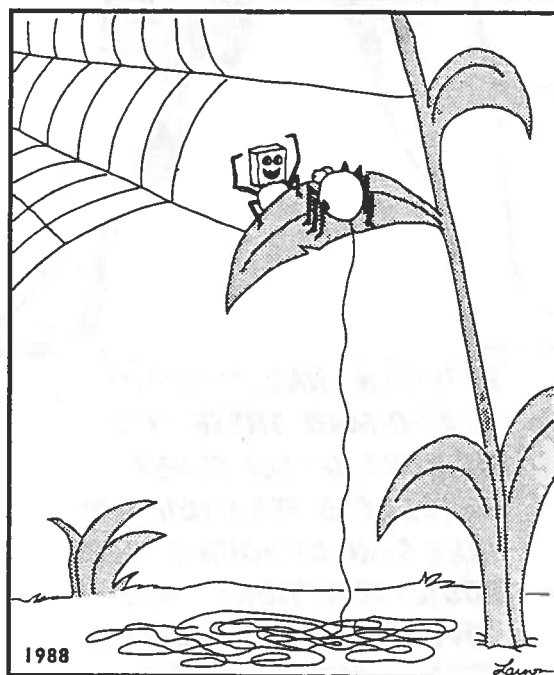

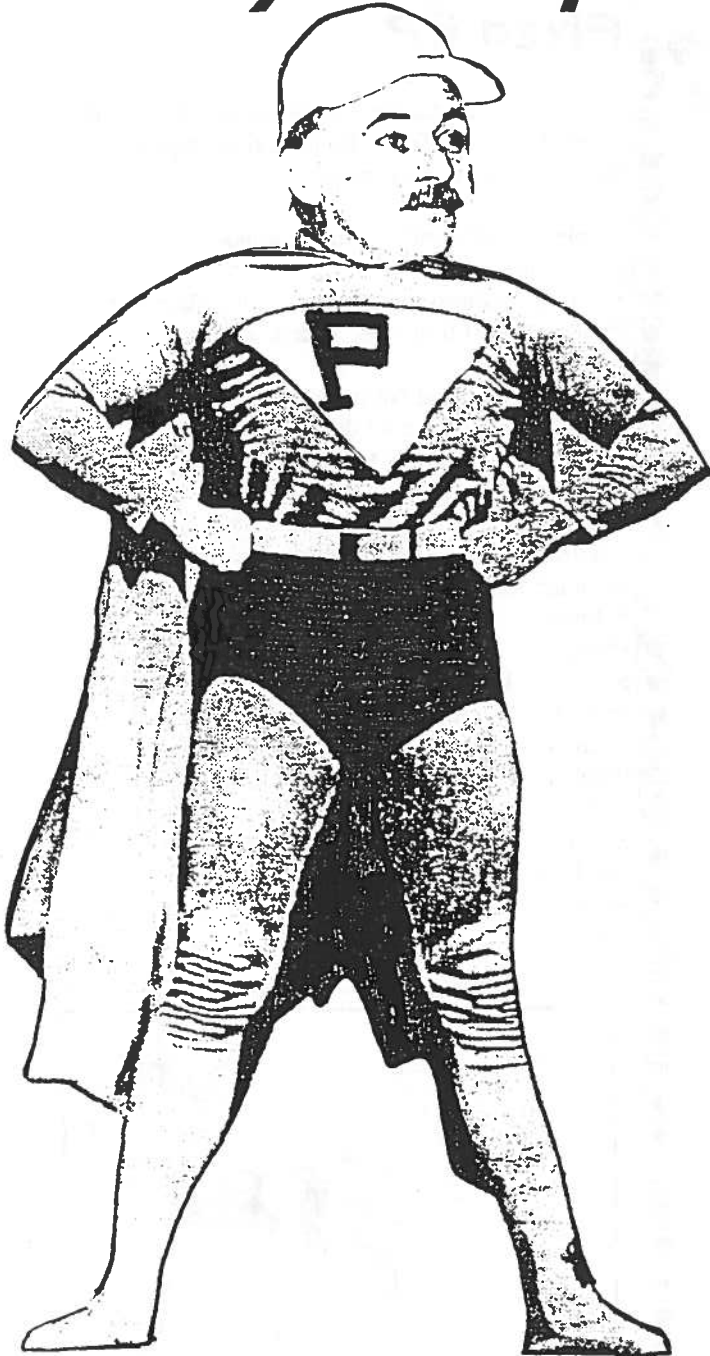
