







Indeed, Dave is a very familiar and omnipresent figure at the house; and for months before and all during the event, you'll see him setting up, getting materials, fixing wiring, checking switches and connections, and making sure that the electricity is flowing where it should be.

But what about shocks? Electricity is very dangerous and there's always a danger of even the best electricians getting shocked.

"Oh, we get shocked occasionally," Dave says. "The tools are insulated and we're very careful." He adds that electricians learn never to take another person's word that the power is really off, but always check it themselves.

"Sounds like the number of people killed by 'unloaded' guns." I say.

"Exactly," Dave concurs. "You always check it out yourself."

He continues that one of his greatest challenges is the large electrical panel behind the stage at the haunted house, which has shocked him on more than one occasion. Although he is a very competent and professional electrical engineer, Dave has no great love for the antiquated electrical panel.

"How old is that thing, anyway?" I ask.

Dave smiled."Let me put it this way. My grandfather ran a hotel in Sharon and he had one just like it to power the place. It's at least pre-Vietnam."

Dave is very generous with his time for the chapter, and does electrical work not only for the haunted house but at Camp Lincoln Hill, and wherever else he's needed.


Dave works for Galloway Electric in Needham, and also for himself at Fisler Electric. He explains that being an electrician has changed a great deal in the past ten years. It's not just wires and switches anymore. "Things are far more integrated. I do data lines, security systems, home theater...if it involves a wire, I do it."

The Dedham resident says he joined the Jaycees because he saw "Good people and good causes." He adds, "I enjoy helping people. I ran the 5K in less than half an hour, did the bike marathon with Chico, sold Christmas trees..."Dave adds that, "If it's a decent cause, I'll work for it."


