

## A Letter from Steve



As discussed at recent GMs, the US Junior Chamber of Commerce (USJCC) Board of Directors, at their meeting in Las Vegas voted to put the MA Jaycees on probation status. This action was prompted by the state being under minimum membership and chapter levels of 500 and 10 respectively. (The best current estimates are 373 members and 9 chapters.)

In addition the current state administration (as we have been painfully aware) has been non-responsive to communications from the national organization and the local chapters.

The USJCC may appoint a trustee of the state organization. In the meantime; Eric Corey of Taunton chapter will coordinate a rebuilding effort with assistance from National officers as well as volunteers from Connecticut and New York.

If the state does not go off probationary staus in six months the National Board may vote to revoke the State charter and assign existing chapters to another state.

How does this impact the Foxboro Jaycees: We continue to be a strong chapter, in terms of members, individual development, friendship and in service to the community of Foxboro. As our membership grows we are contributing to the growth of the state organization. In this regard we should be able to lend a hand as we enter our Haunted House season where we usually pick up a number of new members. Our chapter can also serve as a model for others. I have seen from other chapters that we are pretty far ahead of the curve in chapter management and service to the community. But in terms of what we do everyday and what we are about and our great traditions this situation has little bearing on us. The national organization has taken over tasks that should have been handled by the state and I think overall things are running pretty well. I have heard from a number of members that they have actually received official membership notifications from USICC for the first time.

I will keep you posted as this situation evolves and would encourage anyone who might like to be a part of the rebuilding effort or possibly with a new state organization to contact me or Eric Corey (508) 824-5629.

On our own front the summer weeks are just flying by. The summer activities are in full swing and going well. Behind the scenes the Haunted House committee is underway and hoping to have the paperwork (insurance, license) completed soon.
