As Jaycee president Steve Tingle and I sat for our "Who's who" interview, he asked me an interesting question: "Did you ever think of interviewing yourself?"

That brought a laugh, and memories of my almost-frog. Yes, I told him, in the first who's who! I nearly got lynched (or frogged) for it. As before, this month continues the grand tradition of interviewing people who are not me. Remarkably, Steve has been in the Jaycee chapter for only two years! I say "remarkably" because Steve is such a frequent presence at Jaycee events that it's hard to believe he's only been a Jaycee for two years!

"I grew up in the East Greenich part of Rhode Island," Steve explains. He and his wife Heather were working in Rhode Island and Sharon, and wanted to buy a new house. After a year in Sharon, they bought a place in Foxboro. The couple have a 2 and a half year old daughter, Emily.

Steve works at Fidelity in the strategic planning and fianc, e group, and describes his job as "Long range planning," and, "evaluating what direction the business is going." He works very long hours.


