Who's who of who's New

Remembering back to when Sandy Smith started this column, I think of all the things I learned about the people I spend so much time with. The little things that perhaps never come up in a "normal" conversation at a Jaycee event. I look forward to doing this for the upcoming year, but I need your help. We need to recruit some candidates for the column. Sometimes it's just a matter of asking the right people, other times it's a matter of asking enough people and eventually people will join.

So this month, unlike before, I went outside the chapter and spoke with Eric Corey the President of the Massachusetts Jaycees. Personally I have known Eric for several years but as always speaking with Eric is an adventure in Jaycees and the commitment one person can have. He truly shows the meaning of the term "one person can make a difference". Eric was not elected to his position as most state presidents are, in fact, at the time there was no executive board for the Massachusetts Jaycees. "I was the squeaky wheel in Massachusetts. Eric Cydel from national told me to put up or shut up so I put up and was appointed as the President of the Massachusetts Jaycees" Eric told me with conviction. Before being appointed, the Massachusetts Jaycees were in disarray from several years of mismanagement and anybody who was around the state Jaycees at the time could see the frustration it was causing a lot of the smaller chapters. And unlike any other State President in the Massachusetts Jaycees history he has brought the state organization higher than ever before. Eric had joined the Taunton Jaycees in 1991 after he had approached the chapter regarding street signs in the town. As Department Head of the City of Taunton Traffic department they needed street signs due to the new 911 system that was being installed in town. When he approached the Taunton Jaycees he recalls "I was interested in the street signs, they told me if I joined and helped on the project, they would give me the money." Not only did they accept his project but he was also elected executive VP at his very first meeting. Taunton Jaycees honored their commitment and Eric honored his and then some. He has served as chapter president 3 times. 92-93, 93-94, and again in 96-97 each time making the chapter stronger and achieving the recognition the chapter needed. We spoke about his most memorable project the Stop, Drop and Roll campaign for fire safety. Not only well received in the community but it also earned them a Golden Rule Award from J.C. Penny corporation which included a monetary contribution to the chapter.

As for the State Job his most memorable time "so far", heads, is "Watching the state grow to be number two and excepting that award with Fiz at the national convention."

As for the future he would like to see "A healthy growth continuing, and not the fake kind, but a positive and consistent growth in the future." That would be what he hopes to continue in the future. "And to have a successor next year!" he adds almost jokingly. After all his hard work to bring the Massachusetts Jaycees back from the brink of extinction Eric truly deserves a worthy successor who will uphold the quality of membership he strives for.

Eric and I have spoken at great lengths about the Foxboro Jaycees and how and why they work. He is glad he has had the chance to meet the people who make it happen and looks forward to the Foxboro Jaycees hosting the August board meeting. "I like the way Foxboro is working right now, Growing healthy for the future." he tells me. Plus the

involvement with the state that the Foxboro Jaycees have had this year only help to make the State organization stronger and healthier for the future. People so often talk about the time commitment that Jaycees can take. I have never had a conversation with Eric where he complained about the time that he takes to be President of the State and for a divorced father with custody of 2 children you know it can't be easy. Eric Jr. (11) and Sarah (7) are his pride and joy and are not lost when the Jaycees are involved. Eric is just the type of person who has so much to give that no matter what he does, he gives it all he has and then a little bit more.
