PARKING:

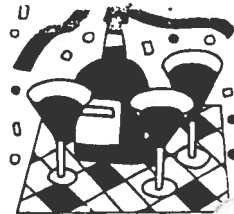

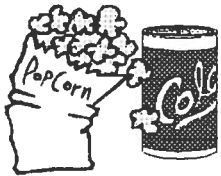
