Secretary's Report Minutes from General Meeting March 14, 2001, 8:00 p.m.

#### Secretary's Report (Drew Hoyt)

#### Treasurer's Report (Helene Savage)

Helene summarized the chapter's financial status. Several motions for <u>Donations</u> were approved: \$100 to Foxboro High School Baseball Diamond Club; \$50 to the Lindsey George, a local student traveling to Europe for a sports-related tour. The \$50 donation to an Ahern School dance will be put to use when the dance occurs.

Bob Hickey reported on the <u>Quarterly State Jaycees Meeting</u>, which was held on March 3. Two big news items from the meeting: Lynda Walsh became a state Senator, and the national dues were raised by \$2. The increase will be passed along to the local chapters.

Fred Badger reported the nominations recommended by the <u>Nominations Committee</u>. The vote for next year's board will take place at the April GM.

#### **New Business**

A <u>By-laws Review Committee</u> has been appointed, chaired by Bob Webster. The committee will recommend amendments needed to put the dues increase in place. A quorum of voting members is needed, so please come to the meeting.

#### Individual Development (Keith Magovern)

Lynda and Sandy have obtained a \$1,000 state grant to help pay for the event, but additional funds are needed. A motion was made and approved to increase the budget for this item from \$500 to \$1500.

The award(s), if given, will be presented at the Installation Banquet.




