Serve Serve

Who is Serve New England?

Serve New England is an independent, private and non-profit program building on and supporting the interests of their participants in local communities. Their participants provide over 100,000 volunteer hours to their communities every month working individually or in local teams. Serve teams work with sponsoring agencies in 350 Chapters (churches, senior centers, apartment complexes, etc.) in New England. There are no eligibility requirements for our participants - anyone can Serve New England!

What is a Food Co-op?

The Serve Food Co-op is a New England wide food buying cooperative for people who volunteer at least 2 hours per month anywhere in their communities. Every month Serve Food Co-op participants can order frozen meats, vegetarian items, fresh fruits and vegetables, while saving about 30% off the retail price of these foods.

Who can participate?

Everyone is welcome to participate. Everyone is eligible to register at a local Site.

What is Volunteer Service?

Serve defines Volunteer service as, "Anything you do for someone else, outside of your immediate family, without pay." You decide how you want to serve in your community. If you are already volunteering, then you're already doing your part, and there's no need to do extra for Serve. You can always join the hundreds of Serve participants who help during "Bagging Week" at the Serve warehouse in Canton, Mass. Our satellite warehouses located throughout New England always appreciate extra help. You can also check with your Site coordinator; Serve Chapters can always use extra help.

Where does the food come from?

We purchase from private producers, growers and wholesalers in New England and the United States. None of the food is donated or government surplus. Each participant's money is pooled with the money from thousands of others, so our buying power is greatly increased. Through collective buying, low overhead, and volunteer power, we are able to provide our participants with high quality, fresh food. The Serve package varies each month. It regularly contains five to ten pounds of meat, four to six varieties of fresh vegetables, two to four varieties of fresh fruits, staples like rice or pasta and a few specialty items.

How many packages may I buy?

You may order as many packages as you want. Just pay for each package and perform 2 hours of volunteer service. Many families order more than one package each month.

How do I buy special packages?

Serve occasionally offers special packages, such as the Holiday package in November and December, Spring Ham Special in March, and Steak packages during the summer months. These have specific purchasing requirements. Check with your Site coordinator.
