Q. Heather, you deservedly won key man this year. What does it feel like to be standing there, holding that award?

Heather: It is such an honor to be named key man. Standing up there at the installation banquet with the award was both exciting and overwhelming. I love all that I do for the Jaycees and I generally shy away from such recognition. However, it is great being part of a group where contributions and commitment are awarded with such tradition.

Q: Max, last year I famously ignored your correct answer at Jaycee trivia night that cost us a game. But getting to know you at those trivia nights, you told recently me an impressive story about your grandfather's military service. Will you share it with all of us here now?

Max: My grandfather served in WWII and participated in the invasions of the Philippines and Okinawa. He was struck by shrapnel a month after the invasion and was subsequently awarded the Purple Heart, Bronze Star and a medal for good conduct. He also received his citizenship for serving in the war.

Q: Heather, you're membership VP this year – what are your plans to attract new members to the chapter?

Heather: I knew that it would be a challenge going in to this board year, but as the number of regular members dwindles, it is becoming more apparent that we have a lot of work to do. One goal is to have more events that are welcoming for prospective members. Meetings are not always the best place to recruit, and sometimes our events at members' houses are too overwhelming for new people. I hope to have a few events this year that can allow us to mingle and interact with prospective members. Another goal is to get our name out in town so that people know who we are, what we do and why they should join the chapter. We have been in the Reporter a few times already this summer and we need to continue to get our name out so that people want to join us, have fun and continue the great projects that we are so proud of as Jaycees.

Q: Max, you have a famously large collection of music and I believe you operate your own web radio station? Can you tell us about that?

Max: Although I don't have my own web radio station anymore, I am a DJ and contributor for www.braingell.com with approximately 30,000 songs in my music collection.

Q: What's the biggest challenge of running a project as complex as Concerts on the Common?

Max: This is our third summer involved in the concerts so we have gotten the hang of it by now. However, the biggest challenge is the logistics that go into setting up that night. Watching the weather is always a bit stressful too! Once the band has been announced and the music starts, we can just enjoy the show with everyone else.

Q: What non-Jaycee activities do you both enjoy? Any hobbies?

Heather: As a working mom of a toddler and a busy Jaycees calendar, I have little time for hobbies outside of the Jaycees! However, I do love reading, so I am looking forward to vacation to hopefully catch up on some books.

Max: The web radio station, and I am in a bowling league throughout the fall and winter and like to ride my bike in the spring and summer. I also love to build elaborate train tracks with our son Matthew and watching Nascar races.

Q: Have either of you ever met a famous person?

Heather: Never met anyone famous

Max: Luis Tiant, Cybil Sheppard, and Jesse Jackson

To both: What's the best advice you've been given?

Heather: Don't wait for success to come to you; go after it for yourself.

Max: Live free and race!
