Thank you and look forward to seeing you all at the GM



Who's Who / New member James Romano

James: I was born in Dorchester but I grew up in Taunton. I lived there up until I finished middle school. Then I moved to Walpole and attended Tri-County, where I was enrolled in the Medical Program. Graduated, took the Red Cross exam, and earned my CNA/HHA certification. I've worked in nursing homes and senior living facilities, but I now work as a home health aide for an agency.

Q: How did you find out about the Foxboro Jaycees? What made you decide to join?

James: I had heard about the Jaycees in passing but I never knew what they were about until my mom had told me one of her co-workers was in the Jaycees and suggested I look into it. It seemed like a great organization and I was looking for something different to occupy my free time (when I seldom have it)

Q: What Jaycee projects have you tried out? Have you chaired a project yet? What have you enjoyed or not enjoyed? Is there an event or project you're looking forward to?

James: I'm a new member so I haven't tried out or chaired any projects yet. I've really enjoyed getting to know the members and getting the word out about the Jaycees. I've yet to find something I haven't enjoyed.

Q. The Jaycees are always evolving and membership is critically important to us. Can you suggest a way for us to recruit new members?

James: I was a little weary of bringing this up at the last board meeting, because it was my first one, but I think we can expand our reach online.
