Most of you may remember the Community Spelling Bee, held in the past to benefit the Palladino Scholarship Fund. The Foxboro Jaycees are bringing back this event to benefit the Foxboro Jaycees Scholarship and other community projects – and we need your help!

The Foxboro Jaycees Community Spelling Bee will be held on **May 16**th **at the Ahern Middle School** at 7:00 p.m. and will benefit the scholarship fund as well as other Jaycee sponsored events. The Jaycees are inviting you, along with others in town, to participate in this fun-filled evening. Please spread the word through your friends and neighbors and feel free to challenge others to participate. Your organization will have the benefit of supporting our community, **free publicity**, as well as perhaps some bragging rights.

The Jaycees participated in the Palladino Spelling Bee each year and enjoyed the event and would like to bring back this community spirited event. If you would like to participate, you'll need to organize a four member team to compete. Your team will compete against three other teams, all four teams will be asked to spell the same word at the exact same time during their round. Each team will be given time to collaborate on the spelling of the word, they will write the word on a 8 ½ x 11 whiteboard, and then when the judges call time, each team will hold up their response. If a team spells the word correctly they remain in the round. If not, they are eliminated from the competition. The spelling words used for competition are official and are provided by the Scripps Howard National Spelling Bee Association. Each team will be given a study guide prior to the event.

Contest Rules:


- 1. Contestants must weigh in on the same scale on the same day each week.
- Percent of body weight lost is calculated by taking the actual weight and subtracting it from the initial weight then divide it by the initial weight. Take that number and multiply it by 100. ((IW-AW)/IW)*100= weight loss percentage
- 3. Start date will be designated
- 4. End date will be designated
- 5. Registration fee of \$10 must be paid during the first weigh-in.
- 6. Contestants can join any time within the first three weeks.
- 7. Winner takes the cash pot and the pool!
