Book Club – Lisa Jolicoeur - On Thursday, June 6th, Book Club members gathered at Lisa's to discuss Kathleen Rooney's "Lillian Boxfish Takes a Walk" while enjoying NY inspired treats: meat and cheese plate, black and white cookies, cannoli, cheesecake, fruit. We shared our personal experiences in NY, reminiscing on travel, plays, restaurants, museums, work, and NY settings in other books we have read.

Lillian takes a ten-mile walk around Manhattan on New Year's Eve in 1984; she is in her 80s and reflects on her life while educating the reader about the challenges of being a successful and intelligent marketing editor in a male-dominated world in the 1930s and 40s. We loved the first-person narration of Lillian, who was witty, charming, and very smart. She is bluntly critical of herself and others. She provided vivid depictions of her son, ex-husband, longtime friend Helen, recent friend Wendy, and people she encounters on her ten mile jaunt, such as a friendly bartender, a restaurant owner, chauffeur, and robbers with whom she exchanges her mink for one of their jackets.


We loved Lillian as a strong character whose breakdown made her very human in our eyes; we were disappointed that her marriage dampened her spirit, but it was an


interesting conversation for us to discuss how women had children and then simply did not work; she had been so defined by her intelligence, passion, and success and basically was forced to reinvent herself in a world that simply did not always meet her expectations, often shown through her critique of the marketing world after she left it.

The novel was delightful and inspired some great conversation for our book group. It was a quick, pleasant read, and the book earned all 2's on a rating scale of 1-5 with 1 being "drop everything, turn off the phone, and read," 2 being "good but leave the phone on," 3 being "glad I bought it and read it but....," 4 being "wish I had not bought it and would not recommend it to others," and 5 being "wish I had not read it." So, this very tough crowd gave this book high marks and engaged in some fabulous conversation!




We will meet in October to discuss our summer reading and select books for future meetings. Have a wonderful summer! Thank you to everyone who hosted this Book Club season! :)




Evolution of a Float

Oh, well that was easy and made me thirsty. Now, let's talk about how a Founders' Day award-winning float came into being. I will not go into all the step by step details as it took 2 weeks to plan and put it all together but will give a quick summary (if you really want to know it all, just wait for the movie). Let's just say it took 11 Jaycees, 3 honorary Jaycees, 2 junior Jaycees, and about 75 trips back and forth to Home Depot (I am exaggerating a bit but it felt like it!).

The planning began at one of our monthly Board meetings. Thank you to Lynda Walsh for the great idea to construct a replica of the bandstand and Town Common and have a band play on it. Max Loew asked our good friends The Gobshites and they accepted. Our normal trailer was not available so Jim DeVellis asked RM Pacella if we could use one of their trailers. Of course, when it was dropped off by an 18-wheeler in my driveway (home base for the last 3 award winning floats, coincidence????), I was



shocked at the size of it. This led to Ken Wills coming up with a design for the construction and an impromptu Memorial Day meeting/cookout was held at my house to iron out all the details (Lynda, Kris, Ken, Pam and yours truly in attendance). The food was incredible as everyone chipped in (oh, and those steak tips...yum, if I do say so myself!).

The crew began the construction with Max, Sophia Manos and Mike Mills joining in on the fun. A special thanks to Max for lending us his radio for the duration. Everything was going smoothly until the time came to put the roof supports up. It was too heavy and came toppling down wiping out 5 of us in the process (Kris,

Lynda, Ken, Mike and myself). Minor injuries ensued and our morale was a little low. But the cavalry arrived, Kevin Mack and Deena Cummings. Kevin designed a new half-shell bandstand and with his trusty nail-gun proceeded to put it together. Kevin made two mistakes though 1) asking me to use his nail-gun 2) forgetting to order his and Deena's sandwiches! (the second one was the worst though, in

my opinion!)

With a fluctuating crew each day/night, we proceeded to put it together. Once the columns were built, Jeanne Suttie (with help from her two wondeful yutes, Ryan and Lena) did a superb job painting them. Lynda put together an awesome copy of the Foxborough sign (wish we could just enlarge it and get it on the Common now!). Ken had already cut the fence pieces from a template Pam made, and Mike painted them. Those shrubs were built by Lynda and Virginia Littlefield (hard to believe hula hoops, chicken wire fencing and garland could look that good!). The float was starting to come together and it was time for painting (Lynda, Ken, Max, Mike, Sophia and myself). If anyone wants verification of the



float being built in my yard, just come and see the infamous "spot" where a bunch of brown paint was spilled on the lawn...LOL! (it's all good Sophia!) A stranger on their walk by the house offered to help as well (ok, it wasn't a stranger but actually Andrea Johnstone who also lives down the street from me). Andrea helped me staple the frills around the float.

The final touches were completed the night before Founders' Day (or so we thought!). The morning of Founders' Day, we were getting everything ready to roll. The Gobshites arrived and began setting up. They had brought a power converter to use to run their equipment. But the driver stated that they could

not attach it to the battery of the truck! What do we do now? It was decided that we would rent a generator from Home Depot and off Max and I went (you thought I was kidding about the Home Depot trips, huh?) Halfway to Home Depot, we were informed that Mike and Sophia had a generator we could borrow!!! They saved the day and redeemed the paint spot that shall not be named! And so once again, the Foxboro Jaycees



dazzled the crowds and took home another award for Best Illustrates the Theme! So thank you all! (in no particular order)
