I would like to know if any of you see Halloween decorated houses on your drive home please let me know, I would like to take the kids on an evening drive to see the faboo-lous houses around our community.



Fruit Baskets: The Jaycees put together fruit baskets to be delivered by the town's Discretionary Fund along with presents for children and other items to Foxborough's less fortunate during Christmas. We've been doing this project for many years and it's one of our Pride Projects for the Community Development Area of the chapter. The chairman would be responsible to gather a committee who will order/pickup fruit, baskets, and wrapping will be done at the South Foxboro Community Center. The Chairman will coordinate with the Discretionary Fund to see when deliveries will be and when the baskets will be needed. A real feel-good project! Common Decorating: The Jaycees have done what we can to decorate the common. The chair would coordinate folks to get our Christmas decorations from storage and decorate the common with garland around the poles and lights on the bushes. This usually takes place along with the Nativity Set up and has been done on the Saturday after Thanksgiving.

Santa on the Common: For the past few years, the Orpheum has requested our Santa and Mrs. to be a part of a holiday party at the Orpheum, and then sit with the Children on the Common. One year we held the Santa on the Common directly after the Children from the event visited with the couple and in other years, we've held it separately. The Chairman would need to coordinate with the Orpheum if need be, and decide whether to hold the public event on that day or at another time where the towns children can sit with Santa and the Mrs.

Foxboro Never Forgets Michael McGinty – Sept. 14, 2019

The Foxboro Never Forgets Memorial of September 11th in Foxboro reminds people to honor and treasure the memory of those who lost their lives by helping others. Hundreds of tributes take place across the country to remember loved ones lost on that dark day in American history, and Foxboro too offers a tribute to honor one

of its own.

For the 15th year, on Saturday, September 14, 2019, Cindy McGinty and a committee of devoted friends and citizens hosted a community event to honor the memory of her husband Michael G. McGinty, a U.S.



Naval Academy graduate and nuclear power and utility specialist for Marsh & McLennan working in his New York office on that memorable day. Mike prioritized family above all else, and Cindy has honored his memory by creating a day for families to enjoy one another. Community was second to Mike, so 100% of all funds received on Family Fun Day in his honor are awarded to local scholarships to young adults who embody leadership in community spirit as Mike embodied. Local students have received \$120,000 since 2003.



This year, an amazing slew of local groups showed their support: Foxboro Rotary Club; Foxboro Lions; Boy Scouts; Knights of Columbus; Foxboro YMCA; Foxboro Warrior Service Club; Foxboro Regional Charter School; and Bethany Congregational Church.

The Foxboro Jaycees were well represented as they have been since the very first event in 2003: Lynda Walsh and Marc Rivard helped with crafts and Thank a Police / Fire Hero cards; Dave Reid contributed as a business sponsor and also had the coveted job of supervising the bouncy houses; Max Loew assumed DJ duties; Devlyn and Derek House documented the event with amazing pictures; and

Laureen House assisted with raffle tables. Pam Warren arrived after

walking in the Alzheimer's Walk to take pictures for the Jaycees as well. Additionally, as they have for years, the Jaycees supported the 80 volunteers who worked at the event all day by donating coffee.
