The characters they meet are interesting and colorful, and the independent spirit of living in the wild is invigorating but unsettling.


Book Club members discussed a range of topics. We had a great deal of sympathy for Leni, who manages, despite her family, to find some happiness and resolution in her life. The


life reading this." So, this very tough crowd gave this book high marks and engaged in some fabulous conversation!



grade, she pursued the idea of a resource dog for Foxboro Schools. She first discussed it with her English Teacher, brought it to the High School Principal, then, obtained the approval from the Foxboro School Administration.



Sara, now a Senior, would like to see Grizz at her side as she graduates. In order to make that happen, Grizz asks for the assistance of the community; helping to raise the necessary funds to bring him to the Foxboro Schools. 


Sand for Seniors ~ Kris Long/Amy LaBrache/Mike Mills/Sophia Manos
